PRACTICE AREA: LITIGATION

Callan Stein is a partner in Donoghue Barrett & Singal's Litigation group, where he focuses on white-collar criminal defense, corporate and commercial civil litigation, healthcare litigation, professional licensing matters, and research misconduct cases. He has practiced in federal, Massachusetts, and Rhode Island courts, and before state and federal governmental administrative agencies.

In his white-collar criminal practice Cal regularly represents corporations and small businesses, corporate officers and directors, governmental and public employees, and other individuals accused of, or being investigated for, alleged white-collar crimes including state and federal False Claims Act violations, securities, banking, insurance and tax fraud, mail and wire fraud, violations of food and drug laws, and environmental violations. In his civil litigation practice Cal represents small and large businesses in general corporate matters and in active litigation involving contract disputes, business torts, alleged violations of ch. 93A, regulatory violations, and employment cases involving wrongful discharge, retaliation, discrimination, and violations of state and federal whistleblower laws. Cal also represents physicians, dentists, physician assistants, nurses, attorneys, CPAs, and other licensed professionals facing disciplinary or other charges before professional licensing boards, as well as scientists, medical researchers, and other academics in research misconduct cases.

Cal also focuses his practice on the growing area of healthcare litigation. He represents healthcare providers charged with, or being investigated for, violations of the False Claims Act, Anti-Kickback Statutes, HIPAA, and the Stark Act, as well as those accused of Medicare and Medicaid fraud such as up-coding, unbundling, rendering medically unnecessary services, or other billing irregularities. Cal also represents healthcare providers, practices, and medical staffs involved in third-party payor disputes, utilization review management issues, and medical staff credentialing issues. Cal has experience representing healthcare providers and employers in employment-related litigation including cases involving state and federal healthcare whistleblower allegations, credentialing disputes, and provider disciplinary matters.

OFF THE RECORD

When Cal was 15 he landed his first job selling sneakers at City Sports. He is still in touch with his manager today.

REPRESENTATIVE MATTERS

- Obtained summary judgment in favor of a quasi-public organization and a former director in a multi-million dollar contract and business tort lawsuit brought by a former vendor
